Jim Bain is an attorney in private practice in North Myrtle Beach. He has been riding motorcycles for over 40 years and has been a member of The Iron Butt Association since 2001, having completed a Saddlesore 1000, the minimum qualifying ride of 1,000 or more miles on a motorcycle in a 24-hour period.

Since then he has participated as a rider in a number of long-distance endurance rallies as both a rider and a member of the rally staff. He is a past winner of The Palmetto Ramble Rally as well as The Beast In The East. In 2007 he competed in The Iron Butt Rally, The World's Toughest Motorcycle Competition, riding to a Bronze Medal Finish and becoming only the 350th person to have ever successfully completed this rally.

Jim is currently the Rallymaster of The Cape Fear 1000 Rally, a multi-day, multi-level event that raises money for the benefit of The Victory Junction Camp for terminally ill children that has become one of the largest and most popular Long Distance Rallies east of the Mississippi.
